In September, 1938 a Fortune magazine poll revealed 67 percent of Americans opposed the immigration of German and Austrian refugees. By the end of 1945 over seven million men, women and children had lost their lives in German concentration camps.

In January, 1993
a **U.S. News and World Report** poll revealed 61 percent of Americans opposed sending U.S. troops to halt the killing of women, children and the aged in Bosnia Hercegovina.
How many Bosnian men, women and children will have died by the end of 1993?

In 1942 the United States had no plans to save the Jews in Europe from extermination believing the situation in Germany to be a European problem.

In 1993 the United States has no plans to save the Muslims in Europe from extermination believing the situation in the Balkans to be a European problem.

In a committee report dated December 20, 1943 urging passage of S.R. 203 recommending a commission be created to formulate a plan to save the Jews, the committee on Foreign Relations stated to the Administration: "We have talked; we have sympathized; we have expressed our horror; the time to act is long past due."
