THE LESSONS OF HISTORY

The Year 1513 - Machiavelli states in The Prince:

"If you do not intervene, you will remain the prey of the victor... Princes who lack resolution take the path of neutralization in order to avoid a present danger and for the most part find it the path to ruin."

September 1939- After taking Austria and Czechoslovakia and crushing Poland, Hitler offers to make peace and to give back part of Poland and Czechoslovakia.

May 1994 - After taking 70% of Bosnia by murder, rape and ethnic cleansing, the Serbs offer to make peace and to give back part of Bosnia to the Muslims and Croatsians.

October 12, 1939 -After learning his lesson at Munich, Chamberlain, in a speech before the House of Commons dismisses Hitler's offer for peace as "vague and uncertain" and states that if Hitler wants peace "acts - not words alone -must be forthcoming."

June 7, 1994 - President Clinton did not learn the lessons of history. Relying on Serbian "words alone," in a speech before the French National Assembly, Pres. Clinton states that he endorsed the peace conference which will partition Bosnia and reward the Serbs for their policy of murder, rape and ethnic cleansing.

President Clinton, by his willingness to reward the Serbs and his lack of resolution in other conflicts has become the prey of the victor and is leading the World down the path to ruin:

May 26, 1994 - President Clinton in a foreign policy speech to the graduating class at the Naval Academy states that his "...willingness to intervene in Bosnia and Rwanda would depend on a sober assessment of the cumulative weight of the interest at stake."

The cumulative weight of the facts are: Bosnia - more than 25,000 raped, more than 200,000 murdered and missing, and more than 1 million ethnically cleansed. Rwanda - 200,000 to 500,000 murdered in 47 days.

What other interest would have to be at stake? Oil? White Christians?

WHO WILL STAND UP FOR THE VICTIMS OF GENOCIDE ?

History records that fifty years ago the first voice of the U.S. Government to issue a call for action to save the Jews of Europe from the ongoing genocide was the Foreign Affairs Committee of the U.S. Senate. It passed the following resolution:
